

## Tanzania - 6 Days Safari

### Day 1: Arusha - Lake Manyara National Park

Leave Arusha after breakfast and drive to Lake Manyara national park for full day game drives with packed lunches. Located beneath the cliffs of the Manyara Escarpment, on the edge of the Rift Valley, Lake Manyara National Park offers varied ecosystems, incredible bird life, and breathtaking views. Lake Manyara's famous tree-climbing lions are another reason to pay this park a visit. The only kind of their species in the world, they make the ancient mahogany and elegant acacias their home during the rainy season, and are a well-known but rather rare feature of the northern park. In addition to the lions, the national park is also home to the largest concentration of baboons anywhere in the world a fact that makes for interesting game viewing of large families of the primates. ### Day 2: Lake Manyara National Park - Serengeti National Park

After breakfast depart for Serengeti passing through Olduvai Gorge, the site of the Leakey family discovery of fossils of human and animal ancestors dating back to almost two million years.

### Day 3: Serengeti National Park - Seronera Area

Full days in Serengeti plains, search for wild game /trailing the wildebeest migration herds/predators. Morning and afternoon game drives. Meals and overnight at Lodge/ Campsite at Seronera area in the heart of the Serengeti. Serengeti is easily Tanzania's most famous national park, and it's also the largest, at 14,763 square kilometres of protected area that borders Kenya's Masai Mara Game Park. Over a million wildebeest and about 200,000 zebras flow south from the northern hills to the southern

plains for the short rains every October and November, and then swirl west and north after the long rains in April, May and June. So strong is the ancient instinct to move that no drought, gorge or crocodile infested river can hold them back. The Wildebeest travel through a variety of parks, reserves and protected areas and through a variety of habitat. Join us to explore the different forms of vegetation and landscapes of the Serengeti ecosystem and meet some of their most fascinating inhabitants. #### **Day 4: Serengeti National Park - Ngorongoro Crater**

We will transfer to the Ngorongoro crater, via Olduvai Gorge. Ngorongoro is an impressive 20 km wide volcanic crater with 600 m walls. The views from the crater rim are breathtaking, and there is an ever-present abundance of wildlife, due to the permanent water supply on the crater floor. Olduvai Gorge is famed for the discovery of 3.5 million year-old fossil fragments of an early human civilization. The views from the top of the crater wall are absolutely breathtaking which are forested but four wheel drive vehicles will take you down into this primeval paradise of woodland, lake, river, swamp and plain that shelters around 20,000 animals. Large grazing animals such as wildebeest, buffalo, gazelle and zebra that depends on the open grasslands in the crater. Attracting predators, the black-manned lion, the leopard and hyena. The elephant found are the lone males. The Fever Tree forests shelter monkeys, bushbuck and waterbuck and the few black rhino that have taken refuge here. A soda lake attracts water birds, including flamingoes and is a favorite place for predators to make their kill. Wildly beautiful as it is, it is not surprising that Ngorongoro Crater has been called a Garden of Eden and the afternoon will be spent at the crater tour. then after the great moment will proceed driving for dinner and overnight at

#### **Day 5: Ngorongoro Crater - Tarangire National Park**

The Tarangire Ecosystem is defined by the long-distance migration of [wildebeest](#) and [zebras](#). During the dry season thousands of animals concentrate in Tarangire National Park from the surrounding wet-season dispersal and calving areas.

It covers an area of approximately 2,850 square kilometers (1,100 square miles.) The landscape is composed of granitic ridges, river valley, and swamps. Vegetation is a mix of [Acacia](#) woodland, [Combretum](#) woodland, seasonally flooded grassland, and [baobab](#) trees. Home to more than 550 bird species, the park is a haven for bird enthusiasts. The park is also famous for the [termite mounds](#) that dot the landscape. Those that have been

abandoned are often home to [dwarf mongoose](#). In 2015, a giraffe that is white due to [leucism](#) was spotted in the park.<sup>[3]</sup> Wildlife research is focused on African bush elephant and Masai giraffe.

Since 2005, the protected area is considered a [Lion](#) Conservation Unit
